Haiti Partnership Report

Psalm 23:4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.



These words from Psalm 23 remind us of God's great love for us even in the darkest of times. Our deepest need is God's presence with us. Even in the valley of the shadow of death the Lord is with us. There is overflowing joy in the presence of the Lord. Even in these dark times our Haitian Brothers and Sisters proclaim *Bondye bon tout tan!* –God is good all the time.

2024 has been another year of waiting on the Lord for an open door in Haiti. It seems that very little has changed. Gangs still occupy much of the capital city of Port Au Prince. A small contingent of international peacekeepers from Kenya has not yet made a significant difference in the city. There have been a few moments of relative peace. Several Teams were able to visit their sister churches this fall. It is important to note that much of the country remains peaceful even as Port Au Prince struggles. The violence, however, has affected the price of all necessary goods. The United Nations has reported that Haiti faces the worst food shortage in history. They reported that 5 million people are food insecure with 1.6 million facing emergency conditions.

The violence in Port has forced many to flee the city. Many of these refugees have fled to places like Policard. As a result, the Policard School has added many new students. This has created an opportunity to share the good news of God's grace with an increasing number of students and their families. In August, Pastor Joseph Duverne assumed the role of Pastor in Policard. We pray that through his ministry, many would grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ. As the school adds new students there is a great need for additional classrooms. We are actively seeking to build a 3 room addition. The cost of this addition will be approximately \$60,000. Yes, that is a lot of money but we believe God will provide. It is a great privilege to sponsor about 130 students through the Hope For Kidz program. These sponsorships provide tuition, uniforms, and textbooks. Additionally, every student is provided a hot lunch each school day. For many, this is the only substantial meal for the day.

We are hopeful that God will allow a team to travel to Policard in March 2025. As we wait on the Lord, we join the RMI staff in crying out to the Lord. We are praying for a better Haiti. A Haiti that all children can go to school. A Haiti that you can travel from one end of the country to the other without fear. A Haiti that we can easily receive teams. A Haiti that those in the hospital can get the care they need. A Haiti that has less natural disasters. A Haiti that has less starving people. A Haiti that has clean water easily accessible. A Haiti that allows all to live without fear. A Haiti that believes in our Savior. Will you join us on your knees and pray for this Haiti?
